

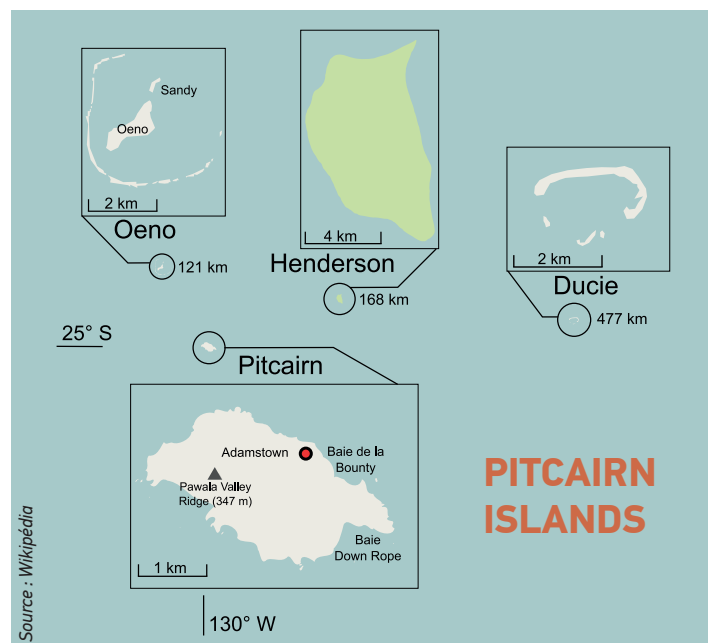
PITCAIRN

PITCAIRN'S ACTION PLAN WAS DEVELOPED IN CLOSE COLLABORATION WITH RESIDENTS, THE PITCAIRN ISLAND COUNCIL AND THE DIVISION OF NATURAL RESOURCES

- Improve waste management
 - Limit soil erosion
- Better manage fisheries resources
 - Control invasive species
- Promote commercial development

➤ FLAGSHIP ACTIVITIES ON PILOT SITES



➤ IMPROVE WASTE MANAGEMENT THROUGH 2 MAIN ACTIVITIES:

- Developing a waste management plan, particularly alternatives to burning, optimising reuse and export of recyclable and hazardous waste
- Purchasing equipment, particularly a plant shredder to promote compost production



➤ REDUCE EROSION THROUGH 4 ACTIVITIES:

- Setting up a nursery so as to re-plant the slopes
- Laying erosion-control mats and planting
- Laying culverts to collect water flowing down the slopes and reduce erosion during heavy rain
- Eliminating goats

➤ HELP DEVELOP TOURISM THROUGH 2 ACTIVITIES:

- Setting up a botanical garden
- Making souvenirs from recycled glass



AS WELL AS:

Managing existing activities (agriculture and coastal fishing) so that they become sustainable by working on a coastal fisheries management plan and through technical support (personalized advice to farmers and training sessions) to inhabitants to make farming practices more sustainable
