- PRC launched in 2003 to combat increasing levels of waste in the Pacific region
- Targets to provide training, technology transfer and awareness raising activities for the joint implementation of the Basel and Waigani Conventions
- SPREP Secretariat for the Waigani Convention
- BUT PRC does more than that...





- PRC also cover aspects of other chemical and waste related MEAs such as:
 - →Stockholm Convention (POPs)
 - → Rotterdam Convention (chemical trade)
 - →Minamata Convention (Hg and Hg materials)
 - →Montreal Protocol (ODS)
- Collaboration with the BRS Secretariat, Interim Minamata Convention Secretariat and UNEP





Background to MEAs

- Preserve and protect the environment from adverse effects of human activities or minimise their impact;
- When States ratify/accede to the Convention formally agree to be bound by an MEA
- Commit themselves to comply with the requirements of the MEA (and in some cases, its associated protocols);





Background to MEAs

- Regulating and, where necessary, restricting or even banning use or trade in certain substances or items through the enactment of national legislations
- Emergence of illegal trade in the substances or items being controlled by MEAs
- For chemicals and hazardous waste there are a number of related MEAs





Background to MEAs

- CITES (International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna & Flora)
- The Chemical Weapons Convention (Convention on the Prohibition of the Development, Production, Stockpiling and Use of Chemical Weapons and on Their Destruction)
- **The Cartagena Protocol on Biosafety**
